



Social Innovation Fund – Selection Process Review Team

The Boston Foundation designed a review team consisting of programmatic, financial and evaluation experts to evaluate and score proposals for selection. Reviewers read and scored proposals using a scoring rubric to ensure consistency, transparency, and fairness. Applications were assessed along selection criteria (Impact and results (25%); Capacity for BosC4C and SIF engagement, including evaluation and growth; (25%) Partnership, fit and potential for impact (25%); and Financial and governance capacity (25%)), alignment with BosC4C goals, programmatic approach, compliance capacity, and the programs' demonstrated level of evidence. In all reviewing activities, the process adhered to TBF's conflict of interest policies and procedures.
